FRANKIE VALLI HAS THE FLU – CANCELS SHOW AT JONES HALL

Rescheduled for April 23

HOUSTON (February 22, 2010) – Managers for the 1960s singing sensation, Frankie Valli, notified the Houston Symphony that Valli has the flu and is restricted by his physicians from singing this week. Due to his unplanned illness, Valli has had to reluctantly cancel his concert at Jones Hall on Thursday, February 25 along with three other performances in Ft. Worth, Biloxi and St. Louis.

Valli plans to return to Jones Hall on Friday, April 23, 2010 for a 7:30PM performance with the Houston Symphony. Any tickets purchased for Valli's February 25 performance will still be valid for the April 23 date. He was inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in 1990 and named longevity champ of the rock era by Billboard Magazine.

Inspired by fellow New Jersey native, Frank Sinatra, and such jazz influences as the Hi-Lo's and the Four Freshman, Frankie Valli always knew he wanted to perform. His most memorable hits include songs like "Big Girls Don't Cry", "Sherry", "Walk Like A Man", "Candy Girl", "Rag Doll", and "December, '63 (Oh, What a Night)". Frankie Valli has continued to woo audiences throughout the world both with his recordings and live performances for almost four decades, truly making him one of rock and roll's most enduring performers.
