Education and Community

The Houston Symphony's education and community activity is increasingly professionalized, expanded, and institutionalized. Chief of Education and Community Programming Pam Blaine leads a five-person team that manages an ever-growing slate of innovative offerings designed to reach specific sectors within Houston, both in breadth and in depth. 2015-16 saw the launch of an industry-leading Community-Embedded Musicians (CEM) initiative, with four musician/educators who spent 80% of their time serving the Houston community through 700 services at schools neighborhood centers, health care settings, and social service organizations. The CEM initiative is the first of its kind for a 52-week, full-time American orchestra, and has enhanced the organization's capacity to serve the community through programs like an intensive on-campus residency at Crespo Elementary School, in partnership with BBVA Compass and HISD, serving all 420 students in grades 3-5 to foster 21st-century learning skills through music education. Other programs include: eight high school residency programs; a new Music and Wellness Initiative which served patients at Texas Children's Hospital and HealthBridge Children's Hospital with music therapy-inspired interactions; and an expanded 20-performance Student Concert Series which served 59,413 Houston-area students. In total, the Symphony's education and community programs served more than 97,000 students, and made the orchestra's music available for low or no cost to more than 150,000 Houstonians.

full-time musicians of the orchestra continued to grow artistically, forging a powerful shared musical language. A thematic thread of the season was music from the American continents, a particular passion for Andrés, including works by Samuel Barber, Leonard Bernstein, James Horner, Pierre Jalbert, Astor Piazzolla, Silvestre Revueltas and Heitor Villa-Lobos. Notable premieres during the season were the world premiere fully orchestrated version of Stomp by John Corigliano, one of America's most celebrated contemporary composers, and the North American premiere of the late James Horner's Concerto for Four Horns and Orchestra, a co-commission of the Houston Symphony and the International Horn Society. 2015-16 was the second year in the tenure of our composer-in-residence, Gabriela Lena Frank, and violist Wayne Brooks was the featured artist in a performance of her La Llorona. Other masterworks performed during the season were Beethoven's Symphonies No. 2, 3, 8 and 9, Ives' Symphony No. 2, Mahler's Symphony No. 5, Brahms' Piano Concerto No. 2 with Emmanuel Ax, Rachmaninoff's Symphonic Dances, Fauré's Requiem, and Berlioz' Symphonie fantasique. For the final weekend of the classical season, the third work of the Symphony's groundbreaking HD Odyssey trilogy, The Cosmos: An HD Odyssey, was featured in its world premiere. Set to the orchestra's performance of Dvorák's Symphony No. 9 (From the New World), the film component of The Cosmos took audiences on a grand tour of the known universe, beginning on the surface of the Earth before zooming out to the most distant objects we can see. The Houston Symphony is a recognized leader in enhancing the audience experience through technology inside the concert hall—as in The Cosmos—as well as on our website through the new On the Music podcast hosted by Musical Ambassador Carlos Botero.

Highlights included: a tribute to the Beatles on the 50th anniversary of their first Houston performance, featuring innovative vocal group Rajaton; a 100th birthday celebration of American legend Frank Sinatra; a world-premiere tribute to Grammy® Award-winning singer/songwriter Carole King; Singin' in the Rain-Film with Live Orchestra; and an evening with Matthew Morrison, the Tony® and Emmy® nominated star of the television show Glee. The season concluded with a newly-curated Houston Symphony show, Journey, The Eagles, Fleetwood Mac & More, bringing together the music of rock performers from the 1960's, 1970's and 1980's. Principal POPS Conductor Michael Krajewski, a beloved Houston figure, will step down following the 2016-17 Season after 17 years of outstanding performances. His successor is Principal POPS Conductor Designate Steven Reineke, the Music Director of The New York POPS at Carnegie Hall, Principal POPS Conductor of the National Symphony Orchestra at The Kennedy Center and Principal POPS Conductor of the Toronto Symphony Orchestra. Reineke conducted 11 concerts during the 2015-16 Season, giving audiences at Jones Hall, Miller Outdoor Theatre and the Cynthia Woods Mitchell Pavilion multiple opportunities to get to know him prior to his appointment as Principal POPS Conductor in the 2017-18 Season.
